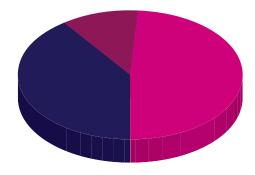

On October 1, 2014, the Library's award-winning It's a Crime Not to Read program was celebrated at an event with community partners and donors.

BURNSWEST Corporation was honoured with the naming of a Children's program room at Central Library and plaques were revealed for program partners, leadership and program supporters, including local Rotary Clubs, CIBC Children's Foundation, the Calgary Foundation and Education Matters.

It's a Crime Not to Read fosters children's literacy with engagement from local police officers and the Library, sparking a love for reading and nurturing the skills and selfconfidence children require to succeed.

BOB EDWARDS AWARD GALA

The 39th Annual Bob Edwards Award Gala **raised over \$280,000** in support of Building Readers for Life during an evening that honoured two provocative Canadians: award-winning Canadian rock musician Matthew Good and legendary singer-songwriter Ian Tyson.

Guests of the gala were treated to a special acoustic performance by Matthew and enjoyed Ian's stories from his experiences with some of music's greatest. As part of the total money raised, donations from the evening will add four new *It's a Crime Not to Read* schools, 12 mini-libraries, 18 career training sessions and 1,040 children's books to the collection.

The Bob Edwards Award Gala, the Library Foundation's signature event, recognizes individuals who are not afraid to speak their minds. Bob Edwards (1859-1922) was Calgary's first media celebrity and the publisher of The Eye Opener, a satirical publication that broke all accepted rules of journalism.

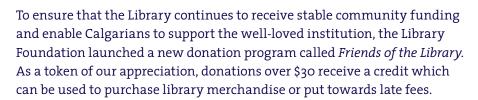






FRIENDS OF THE LIBRARY
