LIBRARY SCHOOL, SUPPORTED BY CENOVUS ENERGY, was officially launched at Central Library in January. This immersive and dynamic learning experience is an extension of the Campus Calgary/Open Minds program. During the 2018/19 school year (including a pilot held in the former Central Library), more than 250 students in Grades 1-7 participated in the program. An event celebrating the program and the Cenovus Classroom took place in May.

On January 19th we celebrated the opening of Calgary's newest Library and the

HOPEWELL EARLY LEARNING CENTRE

This Library—the 21st in the system—is located in the Seton YMCA and serves the growing south quadrant of the city. In addition to a Teen Centre, bookable meeting rooms, and programs and services, the newest early learning space is built around a real helicopter courtesy of the Hangar Flight Museum.





On February 1st, we hosted the first **LOCKED LIBRARY AT THE NEW CENTRAL LIBRARY**. 1,269 participants showed up on a cold evening to explore the building (many, for the first time) and puzzle their way through different genres of books to escape. Two subsequent Locked Library events were held this year; a Fairytale-themed one in July, and one in partnership with Beakerhead in September.

Taylor and Charlotte are sisters that have a very special family tradition. Every year on their birthday, the two forego gifts in favour of a contribution to the **TAYLOR & CHARLOTTE YOUNG SCIENTIST FUND**, which provides access to science and math programming and collections for children.
This year, they held their birthday parties at Central Library, and celebrated \$38,201 in donations to date, which has purchased almost 800 juvenile science books for the Library. Thank you and your parents, Taylor and Charlotte!

Christine Gingerick, Director of Donor Relations, gave a presentation to a local chapter of **BETA SIGMA PHI**, an international women's friendship network.

Beta Sigma Phi has supported the It's a Crime Not to Read program for two years, and in 2018, they purchased a new Central Library Window to commemorate its 15 chapters across the city. A number of the chapters have participated in Library Tours and visited their window, which reads, "Calgary Beta Sigma Phi, Life Learning and Friendship."



April 10th marked the launch of **LIBRARY GIVING DAY**, a fundraising movement to support public libraries. We joined libraries across North America to raise awareness and funds, and the day acted as a precursor to our work for the International Library Fundraising Conference in July.



Our **2019 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING**

was held in the TD Great Reading Room at the Central Library. The event marked the retirement of two members of our Board of Directors; Patricia Moore, Chair of the Board, and Brenda Nicholls, Treasurer. We want to thank them for their dedication and years of service. Carl Landry was officially named Chair of the Board of Directors, and we welcomed four new members; Jason Jogia, James Pettigrew (Treasurer), Sabina Shah, and Rob Van Wielingen.



ROZSA ARTS AT THE LIBRARY launched on May 25th. The ten-year performing arts program brings accessible arts and culture experiences to all Calgarians through the Library while supporting the work of emerging and mid-career performing artists. In 2019, more than 1,500 Calgarians attended performances by five different performing artists and groups.

Five libraries were transformed into Superhero Headquarters on June 1st for the first-ever **SUPERHERO DAY**. The event, which saw a 21% increase of visitors at Crowfoot, Country Hills, Central, Quarry Park and Village Square libraries, acted as the official kick-off for the Library's Ultimate Summer Challenge.





TRACY JOHNSON WAS APPOINTED CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER OF THE LIBRARY FOUNDATION effective July 2nd. In her new role, Johnson will oversee all strategic initiatives and provide direction for the next chapter of the Library Foundation.

In July, we were the first Canadian Library
Foundation to host the INTERNATIONAL
PUBLIC LIBRARY FUNDRAISING
CONFERENCE. Library fundraising
professionals from North America came
together at the Central Library to network,
explore common areas of interest and hear
from other fundraising experts.





The Library's multi-faceted summer program, the **ULTIMATE SUMMER CHALLENGE**, celebrated a successful run, with more than 24,000 children and 2,499 teens registered, and a 199 per cent increase in hours read city-wide. The program supports school readiness, reduces the effects of summer slide, fosters socialemotional growth and reduces barriers to Library services. The 2019 program was presented by the J K L MacLachlan Family Fund, and included program partners Susan Anderson, the Glen & Nancy Charitable Gift Fund and Panago.



We celebrated a transformational gift to enhance the Library's Early Learning Strategy from local entrepreneur and philanthropist Susan Anderson—one of the largest gifts in our history. In recognition of this gift, the **JOCELYN LOUISE ANDERSON**CHILDREN'S LIBRARY was named at Central Library in honour of Anderson's mother, who was a school teacher.

On September 1st, MARK ASBERG WAS NAMED CEO OF THE CALGARY PUBLIC LIBRARY. Over the past five years, he has led a number of transformative initiatives at the Library, including expanding service to new communities, enhancing virtual and mobile services, and developing productive partnerships with key government and community groups.





In honour of former Calgary Public Library CEO Bill Ptacek, who passed away peacefully on October 15th, we partnered with the Library to launch the BILL PTACEK FUND FOR INNOVATION. This fund, which was created in consultation with the Ptacek Family, will support the growth of bold new ideas and initiatives at the Library in memory of this imaginative and passionate leader. CENTRAL LIBRARY'S FIRST BIRTHDAY was

certainly a cause for celebration, and on November 2nd, Calgarians were invited to its party. The event featured a special storytime with Mayor Nenshi, a Friendship Round Dance, pop-up performances and activities, including a Plinko Game hosted by the Library Foundation. In its first year, Central Library welcomed more than 1.74 million visitors, checked out nearly 754,000 items and delivered an astounding 5,100 programs.

With more than \$1 million raised and 2.500 window inscriptions, the WINDOWS OF OPPORTUNITY **CAMPAIGN** closed on November 4th.

The FISH CREEK EARLY LEARNING

CENTRE was the Library's first Early Learning Centre. The Library has learned so much about how little learners use the area since it opened in 2016. In November, we celebrated the reopening of the expanded space, which includes a Questionarium for school-age kids.

On November 22nd, a group of donors met the innovative new leaders of the Library and Foundation and learned about their VISION FOR THE FUTURE.



The Central Library was included in TIME MAGAZINE'S GREATEST PLACES. Its architecture, large collection of books, and cutting-edge educational resources helped land it a spot on the list.
