MENTAL HEALTH AND WELLNESS

In 2022, generous donors supported more than 1,872 hours of the Wellness Desk, which provides access to mental health and wellness services with mental health professionals. The service is now offered at three locations five days a week; Central Library Tuesday through Friday, Crowfoot Library on Mondays, and Shawnessy Library on Wednesdays.

From January through November, more than 399 individuals were supported through the Wellness Desk. 64% of clients reported accessing the Wellness Desk for the first time, and 30% accessed mental health services for the first time ever. The Wellness Desk extends the Library's place as an integral connector between individuals and the resources they need to improve and enhance their lives.

FREE. PERIOD.

Last year, generous donors gave \$35,000 towards the Free. Period. Initiative. Since the program launched in 2021, more than 25,000 products have been distributed via nine dispensers in five Library locations. In 2022, the Library expanded the pilot to include Saddletowne, Forest Lawn, Judith Umbach, and Louise Riley libraries.

The City of Calgary, in partnership with the Library and Youth Central's Mayor's Youth Council, launched this pilot project in September 2021 to combat Period Poverty. *Free. Period.* provides free pads and tampons to anyone who needs them by making them available in Library washrooms—with no stigma or judgment.

MY FIRST BOOKSHELF

In 2022, donors enabled My First Bookshelf to expand to 2,500 children and delivered 24,325 books through the program, which delivers free books monthly by mail to children from birth to age five.


With only 20% of participants due to graduate in the next year, the demand for My First Bookshelf currently outpaces availability. Additionally, Dolly Parton's Imagination Library is increasing pricing by 30 cents per book to accommodate rising postage, fulfillment, transportation and book costs. While this increases the cost of the program, with your support, we are forging ahead to ensure that every child who registers will continue to receive the books through their fifth birthday.

HUMAN RIGHTS AND HOLOCAUST EDUCATION

In January, Calgary Public Library and Edmonton Public Library launched a new initiative to raise awareness and engage Albertans in critical dialogue about Human Rights and Holocaust Education. A group of generous donors enhanced Human Rights Collections at both libraries and enabled new partnerships that resulted in classes and events to share ideas and support dialogue.

Since the launch, we have held 12 programs which have reached 2,149 Albertans and 14,322 students. We have deepened our relationship with Edmonton Public Library, and enhanced our collections with relevant and important Human Rights and Holocaust Education resources.





In 2022, we held three 50/50 raffles which raised \$62,140 for physical and digital Collections at the Library. With 95,000 new members last year and more than 16.3 million items borrowed, the demand for Collections has never been greater.

Our annual Charitable Gift Guide allows donors to support the area of the Library that means the most to them. The most popular areas of support this year included highest priority, collections, and My First Bookshelf.


