

As a donor to Calgary Public Library Foundation, you lifted our community to greater heights in 2023. Many challenges face our community — and thanks to you, the Library is a place where potential can be reached, barriers torn down, and creativity encouraged.

In March 2023, I watched as Library supporter and installation artist Maria arranged a beautiful sculpture of balloons to celebrate the opening of LibraryStore+. As we chatted, I asked Maria how she found herself in the unique career of balloon art. I was amazed to hear that her love of balloons has a profound connection to what the Library provides to her and her three daughters. For Maria, balloons are more than a colourful display, just like the Library, they are also a symbol of hope, joy, and possibility:

"I have loved balloons since I was eight years old. In the Philippines, where I grew up, we go for Sunday Mass. Vendors outside the church sell food and—guess what?—balloons. On rare occasions, my father would ask me what I'd like after service, and I'd pick a bright balloon. The excitement of being asked what you really want and then receiving it has become etched in my heart."

GIVING A LADDER UP ON LITERACY

In spring 2023, our donors sounded the alarm and launched the Ladder Up on Literacy campaign to relocate Engine 23—the decommissioned fire truck-turned-Early Learning Centre that has been in storage since 2018—to Fish Creek Library.

Fish Creek Library is our city's largest community Library location and serves almost 100,000 Calgarians, especially young families and caregivers. Engine 23 will transform the Library location into a must-visit destination for families from across Calgary. The space will engage children with its unique hands-on approach to literacy, skill-building and safety education, all while providing five-alarm levels of fun.

By purchasing a vinyl brick to inscribe with their name or message, donors have been a critical part of Engine 23 Brick-Buy-Brick campaign. These vinyl bricks will be installed in the Engine 23 space at Fish Creek Library in 2024. On Library Giving Day, an international day of Library philanthropy and advocacy, supporters were asked to Stop, Drop, and Donate, with every dollar matched by a generous donor.

DISPENSING EQUITY

In July, our team announced a \$100,000 gift from Shoppers Foundation for Women's HealthTM in support of the Free. Period. initiative. This contribution enables Calgary Public Library to implement free access to menstrual products at all 21 of its locations, an initiative that is sustained by Library Foundation donors.

The Library and Shoppers Foundation for Women's Health share a commitment to address period poverty. Free. Period. is an entirely donor-funded initiative that reduces the stigma and challenges faced by people who menstruate and makes essential products more accessible across the city.

Since the Free. Period. program launched in 2021, it has provided hundreds of menstrual products through dispensers in Library washrooms.

Financial donations in support of Free. Period. continue to be gratefully accepted. Funds raised will stock washrooms at all 21 Library locations with accessible menstrual products for anyone who needs them.

UPLIFTING MOMENT

BARRIER-FREE ACCESS — MENTAL HEALTH & **WELLNESS**

In 2023, hundreds of individuals were able to access barrier-free mental health and addictions support through the Wellness Desk, an innovative, donor-funded initiative.

With registered social workers on location at Central, Crowfoot, and Shawnessy libraries, the Wellness Desk, in partnership with Wood's Homes, represents the innovation that donors make possible through the Library. The Library is a community connector providing access to the resources people need to improve their lives.

"In my time supporting Wellness Desk clients, I have learned that what they all have in common is that they are looking for connections of some kind. Whether it's connection to ideas, stories, thoughts, feelings or to people, libraries are safe spaces to grow connections and to learn."

LIFELONG LOVE OF READING

Since 2020, My First Bookshelf has become a hugely popular and successful early learning program. Delivering free books by mail on a monthly basis to children from birth to age five, the program creates a lifelong love of reading and puts books in their homes.

My First Bookshelf has demonstrated numerous successes in the brief period it has been offered. In a survey conducted in 2023, 87% of respondents said that the program motivates them to read with their children at least twice a week.

Program capacity has increased numerous times since the program's inception, in order to keep up with a near-insatiable community demand. In total, more than 1,100 children in Calgary have graduated from My First Bookshelf, receiving their final book the month of their fifth birthday. Graduating participants, ready to start kindergarten with a burgeoning love of reading, receive a parting gift through another donor-funded Library initiative: Kindergarten Book Bags.

EVEN MORE UPLIFTING MOMENTS

LIBRARYSTORE+

Between March and September, the Library Foundation operated LibraryStore+, a pop-up at Central Library. This temporary physical storefront project was a completely volunteer-run initiative, selling simple snacks, hot beverages, and LibraryStore.ca's most popular products. As always, 100% of proceeds were donated to Calgary Public Library.

LibraryStore+ was very popular with Library members and staff alike. It provided a wonderful lift to engage our community of volunteers (1,654 volunteer hours logged!) and to share the impact that Library Foundation donors provide. The pop-up raised more than \$23,000 —this is the equivalent of 749 brand-new books for the Library's collection!

HUMAN RIGHTS AND HOLOCAUST EDUCATION

The Human Rights and Holocaust Education initiative raises awareness and engages Albertans in critical dialogue through impactful programs, events, and speakers. A joint initiative of Calgary and Edmonton's public libraries, Human Rights and Holocaust Education programming is supported generously by a group of Library Foundation donors. In 2023, these donors supported 17 different events, reaching 5,397 people.

This program is supported by the Isadore and Florence Burstyn Memorial Fund, KSW Calgary Holocaust Education & Commemoration Endowment Fund, and donors to the Human Rights and Holocaust Education Fund at the Calgary Public Library Foundation. Holocaust programming is delivered in partnership with the Calgary Jewish Federation.

EPILOGUE SOCIETY

We celebrated a generous group of donors and shared more about leaving a legacy for the Library at our inaugural Epilogue Society Tea, which took place at Central Library in the spring.

The Epilogue Society is comprised of forward-thinking donors who have pledged a legacy gift to Calgary Public Library in their estate planning. The group continued to grow in 2023 with gift commitments and interest from both new and longtime donors.
