INTRODUCING READERS AND LEADERS

One of the Library's longest-running donor-supported outreach programs was reinvented for the 2024–2025 school year. Formerly known as It's a Crime Not to Read, **Readers and Leaders** builds excitement around reading through visits from firefighters, police officers, EMTs, and 911 operators, who lead storytimes and activities that help students become familiar with first responders and the roles they play in our community.

VIVID IMAGINATION

ENGINE 23 RIDES AGAIN

Just over a year after the Library Foundation launched the Ladder Up on Literacy campaign to return **Engine 23** to service, the dynamic play-and-learn educational installation reopened to the community in Fish Creek Library in April. In the days and weeks following Engine 23's grand opening, visits to this Library increased by 40%. The redeveloped Early Learning Centre, with Engine 23 at its heart, applies the Library's cutting-edge design thinking to an environment where children can engage in play-based learning, learn about fire safety, and become familiar with the role first responders play in our community.

Donor support was instrumental in completing this project, including gifts made by supporters of the **Brick-buy-Brick initiative**, with inscribed messages on 539 vinyl "bricks" now displayed on the community donor wall in Fish Creek Library's Early Learning Centre.



VIVID DREAMS

A BLUEPRINT FOR LOOKING UPWARD—PROTOTYPE: SKYVIEW

The Library's newest innovation occupies a simple storefront in the Skyview Ranch neighbourhood, but, to borrow a phrase from our friends in the Collections department, don't judge a book by its cover. **Prototype: Skyview** is a brandnew service-delivery solution, one developed with support for newcomers and everyday digital needs at the forefront. This temporary location provides residents of Skyview and the surrounding communities with technology and gathering spaces as plans take shape for the area's full-service Library location.

The flexibility of unrestricted gifts enables the Library to respond in innovative ways to emerging community needs, such as the needs of newcomers to Calgary. Donor support for Prototype: Skyview will be crucial in 2025 and beyond as the Library continues to provide much-needed digital resources while planning ways to reach Calgary's newest communities.

CALLING CANADA HOME

Because the Library offers free access to a wealth of resources to help make the settlement experience as easy as possible, it's often a first stop for many newcomers to Calgary. Through Library initiatives that connect newcomers to the city's settlement agencies, develop their Englishlanguage skills, or provide access to resources like free Wi-Fi, printing, and computers, donors are helping new Calgarians build a sense of belonging in their new community.

SUPPORTING MENTAL WELL-BEING

INSIGHT THROUGH AWARENESS

The Library's **Human Rights and Holocaust Education** program provides opportunities to raise awareness and engage in critical dialogue about the contemporary state of human rights and the historical impact and legacy of The Holocaust. The program's 2023-2024 slate included 14 events that attracted more than 5,700 participants and attendees.

2023-2024 Human Rights and Holocaust Education programming is supported by the Isadore and Florence Burstyn Memorial Fund for Human Rights & Holocaust Education, KSW Calgary Holocaust Education & Commemoration Endowment Fund, and donors to the Human Rights and Holocaust Education Fund at Calgary Public Library Foundation.

INSIGHT THROUGH CONNECTION

Through the **Job Desk**, Calgarians are connected to resources for job-seekers and strategies for career planning and transition. In 2024, the Job Desk served almost 4,000 Calgarians with a high level of satisfaction: 98% of Job Desk users rate their experience using the resource as very good or excellent.

The Job Desk is operated in partnership with Bow Valley College and supported by the Government of Alberta.
